

# Reche Canyon Naturist Association (RCNA)

## Code of Conduct

### *(Governing Excerpts Compilation)*

#### Purpose and Scope

This document compiles **verbatim excerpts** from RCNA’s governing documents that collectively establish expectations for member conduct, behavior, and participation.

This document **does not create new policy**.

It is a **reference compilation only**, derived directly from board-approved RCNA governing materials.

### 1. Non-Sexual Naturism & Respectful Conduct

**Source:** RCNA Bylaws — Article III (Purpose)

“Naturism, as practiced within our association, is a private and social practice that is non-sexual in nature. Our culture is welcoming to singles, couples, and families, and we are firmly committed to providing a respectful, responsible, and inclusive space where naturism is embraced as a healthy, body-positive lifestyle.”

“Our Association is dedicated to ensuring that members have the right to practice social nudity in appropriate settings, provided that such practice does not infringe on the rights or dignity of others.”

### 2. Member Conduct & Good Standing

**Source:** RCNA Bylaws — Article VII (Membership)

“Membership in the Association shall be limited to individuals who share a common interest in naturism and who adhere to the Association’s bylaws and the rules and regulations established by the Association.”

“A member in good standing:

- Is not in arrears on RCNA annual dues and/or fees.
- Has not committed a breach of propriety associated with naturism, or with respect to the rights of others.”

“A member has given up all rights and privileges in the association if they have breached any of the requirements of the Bylaws.”

### 3. Anti-Discrimination & Equal Treatment

“The Reche Canyon Naturist Association (RCNA) is committed to fostering an inclusive, welcoming, and respectful environment for all individuals.”

“RCNA does not tolerate discrimination or harassment based on race, colour, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, marital status, disability (mental or physical), medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law.”

### 4. Event Behavior & Community Standards

“RCNA is committed to providing a space where naturism is practiced in a respectful, non-sexual context.”

“These events are carefully designed to eliminate the pressure or discomfort that can sometimes arise in environments where naturism is misunderstood, ensuring that

everyone feels safe and accepted regardless of their background, body type, or personal history.”

“The committee ensures that these events uphold the association’s commitment to a safe, non-sexual environment.”

## 5. Photography & Privacy

“Photography as deemed appropriate by the board for each event.”

## 6. Reporting Misconduct & Grievances

“Any association member may register an official grievance by preparing it in written form, via email, or written letter and sent to the secretary.”

“The board will advise whether the grievance shall be the responsibility of the board to address.”

“The aggrieved has the right to appeal to any decision made by the board.”

## 7. Fundamental Rights & Personal Dignity

“Nudists have the right to hold their values and beliefs.”

“Nudists have the right to assemble in the nude within appropriate settings.”

“Nudists have the right to be treated as law-abiding citizens.”
